KIDS TAG ART PROGRAM RAISES OVER \$1.5M FOR CLASSROOM ARTS EDUCATION IN FLORIDA

Tedder and team presented a check to the school board in the amount of \$40,779 which brought the grand total of funds raised for arts education in Polk County to \$502,392. Joe G. Tedder said, "It is amazing the Kids Tag Art program is making this kind of impact in Polk County and across the state. I am thrilled for our educators, students and the many community partners that have played a major role in the program since its inception."

The Kids Tag Art program continues to inspire fifth graders throughout the county in innovative thinking and creative problem solving, all while students design their own specialty vanity license plate. With the support of teachers, family, local business sponsors, and the community, Polk County public, private, and charter schools were able to sell the tag art at www.KidsTagArt.com, with all proceeds going back into the classroom for arts education.
